The Land of Fire and Ice - July / August 2014

Magical, mysterious, awe-inspiring. Many places on earth claim to be lands of "fire and ice." Perhaps only Iceland is both at the same time, and today! Part of the mid-Atlantic spreading seafloor ridge, only this portion rises above sea level to create this island nation. Active volcanic flows build new land each day, right in the midst of glaciers. Here lives the largest volcanic canyon in the world, offering splendid display of nature's phenomenal power. With scenic beauty beyond belief and 24 hours of daylight during summer months, this is an ideal and rare gem for a photo safari which has exceeded all of my guest's expectations as noted in their tour evaluations.

With the help of photographer and local Icelandic guide, Haukur Snorrason; the delightful hospitality and home cooking of his wife Hadda, and the charming accommodations of our Icelandic guesthouses along the way, you will see more of Iceland's "secret places" that even you can believe. Despite "a touch of rain," which seems to be a part of this extraordinary destination we will explore and photograph jawdropping waterfalls and remote glacial landscapes, lush highlands, moss blanketed lava fields, geysir and geothermal areas, calving glaciers, icebergs on black sand beaches, puffins, razorbills, fulmars and the famed Icelandic horses. Despite the fact that it lies just below the Arctic Circle, Iceland is warmed by the Gulf Stream, so enjoys a temperate climate.

In addition to its current riches, Iceland boasts a powerful human history as well, with early Vikings having created ancient seafaring history under the same midnight sun that gently warms us today. Signs of their earlier world are everywhere, a constant reminder of the ways in which human and natural history have become inextricably intertwined. And with place names such as Skaftafell, Jokulsarlon, Landmannalaugar, Hrafntinnusker, Kerlingafjoll, Vatnajökull, and even Reykjavík, all of which defy pronunciation, this is indeed a land that evokes mystery and wonder.

If you're passionate about photography, whether novice or advanced, and want to experience the ineffable wonders of Iceland, this is the trip for you. If you are traveling with a companion who is not a photographer, perhaps they'd like to capture yet another unique view of nature's experience using a video camera.

Day 2: July 19th – Arrive Iceland & Reykjavik

Arrive into Keflavik International Airport. Transfer to hotel in Reykjavik. Day to relax, stroll around Reykjavik, early evening orientation, group "Welcome" dinner.

Day 3: July 20th - Snaefellsnes Peninsula

Snaefellsjokull Glacier backdrop to Budir Church and Arnarstapi bird cliffs - Kittiwakes and Fulmar bird colonies – Pufubjar bird cliffs/Londrangar Volcanic Sea Stacks

Day 4: July 21st - Latrabjarg Cliffs

Ferry across Breidafjördur Bay to Brjánslaekur – Dynjandi Waterfalls – Látrabjarg cliffs – Abounding with Puffins, Razor Bills and Guillemots

Day 5: July 22nd - Latrabjarg Cliffs

Morning Coastal Vistas along West Fjords – Patreksfjordur Fjord - Evening Látrabjarg cliffs – Puffins, Razor Bills and Guillemots

Day 6: July 23rd – North Iceland Bound & Hvítserkur Sea Stack Depart West fjords for North Iceland - Kolugljúfur canion waterfall – Hvítserkur Sea Stack

Day 7: July 24th - Kjölur highland route, Hveravellir & Kerlingafjöll

Travel north highland road Kjölur – Hvervellir geothermal area -Kerlingafjöll (woman's mountain) – Rhyolite Mountains/canyon

Day 8: July 25th - Fjallabak Nature Reserve

Early morning shoot Stokkur Spouting Hot-Springs – "Guests Favorite" secluded waterfall - Barren Fields of Lava and Volcanic Sand – Rhyolite, Hyaloclastide and Mossy Green Mountains

Day 9: July 26th - Landmannalaugar Area

The next two days will be very special days...one breathtaking photo stop after another of the southern interior - North Fjallabak route towards Landmannalaugar – Nyðri-ófæra River waterfalls - Eldgja - Landmannalaugar geothermal area, lava field & colorful Rhyolite mountains – Cook-Out/Overnight Landmannlaugar Hut

Day 10: July 27th - Langisjór Lake, Skaftá River & Sveinstindur Mountain.

Continue to explore the southern interior of Iceland ...Remote Langisjór Lake (Long Lake) surrounded by Hyaloclastide Mountains Fögrufjöll & Breidbakur Mountain - Sveinstindur Mountain Vista overlooking Glacial River Skaftá.

Day 11: July 28th – Skaftafell Nat'l Park & Jökulsarlon Glacial Lagoon

Skaftafell National Park - Svartifoss Waterfall - Fjallsarlon glacial lagoon – Breioamerkurjokull Glacier – Jokulsarlon Glaciial Lagoon – Icebergs on Black Volcanic Sand Beach

Day 12: July 29th - Hrafntinnusker

Another day saturated with photographic opportunities. Hrafntinnusker (Iceland's second most powerful geothermal area) - Vast expanses of grandeur - Tiny springs flowing through Apple Fountain moss - Rhyolite mountains resembling watercolor paintings - bubbling mud pots.

Day 13: July 30th - Öldufell's Route

Parade of Waterfalls - Öldufell Route - Neon green moss areas -Black volcanic sand dunes - Cascading Waterfalls - Bláfjallafoss waterfall and Axlarfoss waterfall.

Day 14: July 31st - South-Coast Route

Traveling towards Reykjavik Explore South Coast Ring Road Photographic locations – Reynisfjara black sand beach with columnar basalt formations - Cliffs of Dyrholaey Cape -Seljalandsfoss Waterfall - The Skogarfoss Waterfall – Farewell Dinner Reykjavik

Day 15: August 1st – Morning in Reykjavik at your own pace Leisurely explore Reykjavik – Shop for gifts and souvenirs – Transfer to airport in afternoon for Icelandic Air Flights Home.

Sone two Reykjavik & Snaefellsnes Peninsula



July 19th & July 20th

Our local guide and Dee Ann will greet you at Keflavik Airport in the early morning to transfer you to the hotel in Reykjavik for July 19th. The 19th will be a day to relax, stroll around Reykjavik at your leisure with an early evening orientation followed by a "Welcome" dinner. Early on July 20th we travel northwesterly to Snaefellsnes peninsula; photographing Iceland's only dark wood church; continuing along the peninsula to Arnarstapi, known for its stunning basalt cliffs and unusual rock formations in the ocean teeming with Kittiwake and Fulmar bird colonies. Further along the south coast of the peninsula we will stop at Pufubjary sandstone bird cliffs and will close our first day of photography at Kirkjufellsfoss waterfall on the northern coast of the peninsula.

July 21st

Our local guide and Dee Ann will greet you at Keflavik Airport in the early morning to transfer you to the hotel in Reykjavik for July 19th. The 19th will be a day to relax, stroll around Reykjavik at your leisure with an early evening orientation followed by a "Welcome" dinner. Early on July 20th we travel northwesterly to Snaefellsnes peninsula; photographing Iceland's only dark wood church; continuing along the peninsula to Arnarstapi, known for its stunning basalt cliffs and unusual rock formations in the ocean teeming with Kittiwake and Fulmar bird colonies. Further along the south coast of the peninsula we will stop at Pufubjary sandstone bird cliffs and will close our first day of photography at Kirkjufellsfoss waterfall on the northern coast of the peninsula.

July 22nd

Since the Puffins and seabird are out on the ocean fishing during the day, we will spend the morning photographing coastal vistas between Breidavik and Patreksfjordur Fjord returning to our hotel for an early dinner. On the second evening, everyone is always anxious to return to Látrabjarg cliffs so we try to get a little earlier start this evening with the enchanting puffins and other seabirds. Puffins...Puffins...Puffins and the Land of The Midnight Sun.

STVE North Iceland Bound & Hvítserkur Sea Stack



July 23rd

After breakfast we will depart the West fjords and drive along the south part of the peninsula taking in more of picturesque Iceland. If we are lucky as we drive today we may get a chance to photograph the famed Icelandic horses.

Since we will start our day at the western most point of lceland, this is our longest driving days, but we will be rewarded in the evening when we reach our northern destination with two dramatic photo stops; the waterfall at Kolugljúfur canion in Vididalur valley and the Sea Stack named Hvítserkur off the shore of Vatnsnes peninsula; old remains of a central volcano enveloped by the ocean.

SIX Kjölur highland route, Hveravellir and Kerlingafjöll mountain geothermal areas



July 24th

After an early breakfast we pack our gear and head further north until we hit the highland road Kjölur; a well known route between north and south since the Viking era. On this route we will find Hvervellir, a small but very photogenic geothermal area which we will spend time exploring for that unique image.

Our next stop is in Kerlingafjöll (woman's mountain), old volcanic mountains with stunning striations of red, green, yellow and white colored by sulfur. Steam rises from bubbling hot spring vents adding even more variations to this location. This location will draw you right in with one dramatic composition after another. If time permits we will also photograph the canyon just below Kerlingafjöll.

Seven Fjallaback Nature Reserve (or south-coast route)





July 25th

This day will greet us with a rather early rise to photograph the famous Strokkur spouting geyser and other hot-springs before tourists flood the area. We will continue towards the south making a stop at a secluded waterfall which has been a guest favorite (This waterfall does not have a name). It depends upon weather which route we will take. If favorable, we take the south highland route through barren fields

of lava and volcanic sand, vibrant mossy green mountains, open rivers and wide fields of the highlands surrounded by Rhyolite and Hyaloclastide Mountains. At the end of our day's journey the hospitality of Hadda and Haukur; and the warmth of their Guesthouse await us with one of Hadda's fabulous dinners.

Seight Landmannalaugar area



July 26th

The next two days will be very special days...some of my personal favorite locations...with one breathtaking photo stop after another of the southern interior. We will take north Fjallabak route towards Landmannalaugar making fissure dating back to 900AD at over 18 miles in lenath. The most spectacular part of the fissure is adjacent to the Fjallabaksvegur Road, where it reaches a depth of nearly 2,000 ft. and Nyðri-ófæra River falls into the canyon in two cascading waterfalls. Continuing to Landmannalaugar a geothermal area surrounded by colorful Rhyolite mountains and lava fields we spend the afternoon hiking to explore this incredible area, returning in the evening to the natural hot springs (Bring your swim suit), dinner cooked under the evening Icelandic sky and our comfortable but basic accommodations at Landmannalaugar huts. (There are indoor showers & bathrooms)

Accommodations: Landmannalaugar Hut

Snine Langisjór Lake, Skaftá River and Sveinstindur Mountain



July 27th

As we continue to explore the southern interior of Iceland today, the remote Langisjór Lake (Long Lake) lies southwest of Vatnajökull glacier in a beautiful and picturesque landscape. It is 20 km long and up to 2 km wide. The lake is among the most beautiful mountain lakes in Iceland with aqua water, islands, and mountain cliffs. To the east of Langisjór Lake are the Hyaloclastide Mountains Fögrufjöll, Breidbakur Mountain on the west, famous for its moonscape and south of the lake is Sveinstindur Mountain and glacial river Skaftá. The vista overlooking Skaftá River is another "Guest Favorite" photo location and may very well be my favorite along with the puffins and Jokulsarlon Glacier Lagoon.

Eten Jökulsarlon Glacial lagoon and Skaftafell National Park





July 28th

Today will be waterfalls, glaciers, a glacier lagoon and aqua icebergs resting on black volcanic sand beaches....Truly eye candy for photographers. We will head to the east towards the Vatnajokull Glacier and make a stop in Skaftafell National Park for a hike to the stunning columnar basalt backdrop of Svartifoss waterfall . From there our Iceland photo safari day will be about "ICE". We will stop at Svinafell glacier and Fjallsarlon glacial lagoon. Over the past 60 years the tongue of the Breioamerkurjokull Glacier has been retreating creating an extraordinary lagoon which flows to the ocean. As the glacier calves aqua blue icebergs and ice formations fall into the lagoon gradually making there way to the ocean; some washing back up onto the black beach. This is a day we will hope for overcast skies to saturate the incredible colors of the ice.

July 29th

Another day saturated with photo opportunities. We will departure in the early morning for a drive up to the remote Hrafntinnusker; Iceland's second most powerful geothermal area. The route to Hrafntinnusker will be an adventure all it's own with river crossings and vast expanses of grandeur, and all along the way there are beautiful photographic opportunities. From tiny springs flowing through viberant green moss, to rhyolite mountains that resemble watercolor paintings, to steam vents and, bubbling mud pits. We will then drive back using the same route but in totally different light offering more photographic opportunities.

≤twelve Öldufell's route



July 30th

If you love waterfalls, you will enjoy the parade of waterfalls along the Öldufell route traveling towards Fjallabak south route along side Hólmsa River with Fountain apple green moss areas, black volcanic sand dunes, streams and cascading waterfalls of all shapes and sizes. Two of those

> that are most notable to photograph on this day are Bláfjallafoss waterfall and Axlarfoss waterfall. Following another memorable day of unrivaled Iceland beauty, we will enjoy our last evening at the cozy Hrifunes Guesthouse.

South-coast route - Columnar Basall Pormacions Skogafoss & Seljalandsfoss Waterfalls & Reykjavik South-coast route - Columnar Basalt Formations,



July 31st

Our last full day experiencing The Land of Fire and Ice we will drive along the south coast of Iceland as we gradually make our way back to Reykjavik for our last night. Along the south coast we will have more photographic opportunities visiting the cliffs of Dyrholaey cape, Reynisfjara black sand beach with columnar basalt rock formations, Seljalandsfoss Waterfall and The Skogarfoss Waterfall; cascading down Iceland's from southernmost glacier, Myrdalsjokull. As we close out our last evening in Iceland we will check into our hotel and enjoy sharing our Iceland memories during our farewell dinner together.

If flying Icelandic Air, these flights depart between 4:30pm & 6:00pm. Haukur will pick up those of us flying Icelandic Air to transport to the airport. If flying Delta, these flights depart mid-morning and your transport to the airport will be at your expense. We will provide information to assist you with booking your airport shuttle reservation (Approx. cost \$25).

Haukur has gained an unique experience which he now uses to guide landscape photographers around Iceland. He has worked with individuals and groups from all over the world. Haukur is also a certified tourist guide and has a private pilot's license. Haukur has accumulated a portfolio of thousands of Icelandic landscape images.

What's Included & More ...







Noteworthy:

- Physical activity / hiking is a component of this trip including uneven terrain and in some location moderately steep inclining as well as loading and unloading the customized 4x4 van throughout each day. You must be in GOOD physical condition to enjoy this trip and not to disrupt the enjoyment of the trip for other guest.
- Recommended international airlines flying to Reykjavik are Iceland Air or Delta. (Average Cost: \$700 round-trip) If flying Delta, their return flights depart mid-morning. Iceland Air return flights depart between 4:30pm and 6:00pm. Our local tour outfitter provided one shuttle transfer on the day of departure to the airport for the Iceland Air flights. You are welcome to fly Delta if this is the most convenient flights for you, however you will be responsible for reserving and paying for your shuttle to the airport (approx.. 50km) (cost \$25).
- The Iceland Air and Delta flights arrive between 6:00am and 7:00am which is the time we will expect all guest to arrive on July 19th. Haukur and I will be there to greet you outside of customs.
- If you would like to arrive a day early, July 18th, I will book all early arrival hotel accommodations on your behalf at the Radisson so all guest are at the same hotel. This additional cost will be included in your invoice (Approx. \$350 per room / double or single).

A Snapshot of How Our Days Will Flow

- Throughout our trip breakfast will be as a group and will be around 7am.
- Morning departures for the day's photo destinations will be between 7:30am and 8:30am depending on the subject and lighting required.
- Lunches will be casual picnic style at our vehicle since most days we will be packing and taking
 our lunches to continue to photograph in the field. Lunches are basic sandwich or soup. In
 some instances we will stop at a restaurant
- Dinner times will vary depending on evening photo agenda.

Included

- Dee Ann will also arrive with numerous individually packaged snacks for guests throughout the day as stores are not always available in some of the remote areas and some days can become long since the sun never really sets.
- Beverages with meals include Icelandic tap water, juices, coffee, tea and soda.
- Alcoholic beverages and specialty coffee beverages (espresso, latte, etc.), guest responsibility
- Gratuities for Icelandic Driver/Guide who will be with us throughout our entire trip.
- Gratuities for meal services at hotels / restaurants
- Gratuities for our Hostess / Chef at Hrifunes Guesthouse.

Not Included (At Guest Expense)

- Domestic air from your home connecting with your international flight to Reykjavik, Iceland is the guest responsibility.
- Laundry services (not readily available since we move locations almost every day)
- Alcoholic beverages and specialty coffee beverages (As noted above).
- Camera Equipment, Computer Equipment or batteries
- Lodging / transportation / airport transfer for pre or post extensions



Guaranteed departure: We guarantee departure on this tour if seven paying passengers book. (Potential exceptions: War, terrorism or rebel alert issued by the US government. We reserve the right to cancel/reschedule the trip because of good-faith concerns with respect to the safety, health or welfare of the participants)

Health Requirements: You must be in good physical and mental health. Any physical condition or treatment requiring special attention must be reported at time of the reservation for determination of participation in the trip without further impairment to yourself or detriment to other guests. Special dietary needs also need to disclosed on the Pre-departure Questionnaire.

Accommodations: Comfortable and pleasant guesthouse / hotel accommodations available to the photo venue / destination each day as well as a charming country-side Guesthouse (nights 7,9,10,11 & 12) as specified in the daily itinerary; and are based on double occupancy. Shared bathrooms are common to Guesthouse accommodations in Iceland.

Meals: All meals included while in Iceland as specified in the "Included List."

Beverages: Icelandic water, juices, tea, coffee and sodas are included during breakfast, lunches and dinners at guesthouses & hotel. Sodas and Juices during daily tour as specified in the "Included List". Alcoholic and specialty coffee beverages are not included.

Vehicle/Transportation: Transportation during the entire photo tour will be with local Icelandic driver / guide in a specialty modified 4x4 van to access remote areas and facilitate required river crossings.

Payment schedule: A 50% deposit, per person, is due at time of booking. A portion of this deposit is not refundable since accommodations, ferry tickets, vehicle / local guide must be booked and secured with deposits well in advance that is non-refundable. Final payment must be made in full 120 days prior to departure. Windows of Nature by Dee Ann LLC reserves the right to cancel a reservation in full if payment has not been received by 120 days prior to departure. We accept Master Card and Visa for the initial 50% deposit only, as well as check or cashiers check. Trip balance <u>can not</u> be paid with credit card.

Cancelations and Refunds: Notice of cancelation must be made in writing (e-mail acceptable) and refunds will be issued based on number of days prior to travel that the reservation is canceled; from the time of booking up to 180 days prior to departure - 75% of deposit is forfeited; 179-120 days, 100% of deposit is forfeited; 119-90 days, 75% of total trip cost forfeited; 90 days or less, 100% of total trip cost forfeited.
